## SYNERGY: Networks in Action

But we're calling it a NETWORKING SEMINAR to be held Saturday, September 6, 1986 in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, following the joint meeting of the Pacific Northwest and Midcontinental Chapters of the Medical Library Association.

Representatives of the Utah Health Sciences Library Consortium and Eccles Health Science Library, University of Utah, will describe the development and implementation of INFONET, an online system that provides information access for health professionals throughout Utah.

Subsequent concurrent sessions will provide an opportunity to examine options for an online interlibrary loan system at the consortium level; a look at the joint online catalog of the Denver Area Health Science Library Consortium and Denison Memorial Library, University of Colorado Health Sciences Center; a discussion about multi-type library cooperation; and guidelines for seeking non-federal grants.



1. In Function KA or KE, the first word of the article title is usually sufficient.
2. Be sure to give inclusive pages for the article you're requesting - it helps the lender decide how to handle the request.
3. Function MX (message function): If you have a print terminal and want to send an all-users message, contact the RML. They will put it on for you. Otherwise, to send an all-users message, enter \* at the "send to" prompt.

When Roz Dudden returned from ICML (International Congress of Medical Librarianship), held in Tokyo this year, she brought a proposal to CCML to "twin" with the University of Ghana Medical School Library. The idea was approved by CCML members at the January meeting. The concept of "twinning" involves the support (more about that further on) of a 3rd World medical library by an American or Western European library. A few such libraries have been "twinned" by consortiums or organizations, and not surprisingly, Roz thought of CCML. The amount of money, energy, or resources expended on supporting the 3rd World institution depends on what is available to be given. Roz suggested \$100.00 and some sharing of extra copies, old editions, etc. She has already received a letter accompanied by a want list of periodicals, and an indication of willingness to consider as gifts anything else we might want to offer. 
