## EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETS

The MCMLA Executive Committee held its midyear meeting April 15, 1989 in Denver. The minutes of the Breckenridge meeting were approved as distributed through the *EXPRESS*. Committee reports were presented and approved. The report of the Executive Secretary was given by Mary Helms, as Bob Pisciotta was unable to attend. His proposed budget categories were approved and travel reimbursement guidelines will be added to the procedure manual. The Barbara McDowell Memorial Fund was approved as a separate budget item.

Prompted by a \$700+ payment to the IRS for sales tax for the Breckenridge meeting, Bob P. is pursuing tax exempt status for the chapter. Three steps are required: 1) to change bylaws specifying what happens to the treasury if the organization dissolves (this will be discussed in Kansas City); 2) to incorporate in the state of MCMLA's mailing address; and 3) to file IRS form 1023.

Bonnie Mack, Chapter Council Representative, reported that the MLA Strategic Plan is being revised and that Audrey Newcomer is writing an operations manual to define the relationship between MLA and the chapters. There was concern voiced about MLA's plan to add several new members to the MLA Membership Committee in an advisory capacity and there is plenty of confusion

concerning the new credentialing program to begin this summer. The Executive Committee asked Bonnie to take their concerns back to Chapter Council which will be meeting in Boston.

The next meeting of the Chapter Executive Committee will be in Kansas City, October 4th from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.

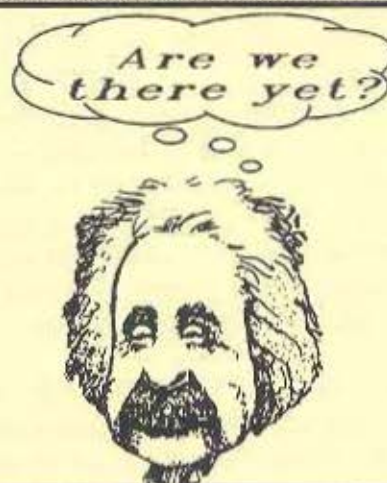

## Library Internship Program

It's as if gifts from the gods were bestowed on Denison Library (University of Colorado Health Sciences Center in Denver).

Donna Keslin, a recent graduate from UC-Berkeley Library School, walked into the library on a wintry day in January, and asked if she could volunteer her time and talents to the Library 40 hours a week, for nine months. In return, she wanted to be trained in the intricacies of medical reference librarianship.

The Information Services staff of Denison Library was stunned, bewildered, unbelieving, highly skeptical, but already beginning to think of the possibilities.

The staff quickly assessed the obvious advantages of such an offer, as well as the potential time involved. With the "blessings" of library administration, they decided to develop an internship program for Ms. Keslin, who agreed to work in the library at least six months.

The primary purpose of this program is for the intern to master the basic concepts and skills required of a medical reference librarian, and to understand the structure and function of an academic biomedical library.

Using two previous studies for background information<sup>1,2</sup>, the following broad goals were developed:

- ① To develop health science library reference skills: communicating clearly, reference interviewing, determining client information needs, developing effective information search strategies, teaching the use of basic bibliographic sources, finding facts and statistics efficiently.
- ② To gain experience with reference tools typically owned by health science research libraries.
- ③ To recognize when online searching is appropriate compared to print tools. To gain and communicate knowledge of content and use of databases commonly used in health science libraries.

- ④ To master basic techniques to search the National Library of Medicine databases.
- ⑤ To work with the Interlibrary Loan Department to understand borrowing and lending philosophy, policies and procedures including verification techniques and tools. This includes techniques and guidelines for accessing various networks.
- ⑥ To assist with the implementation of the Extension Program test phase, including development of print materials and brochures, record-keeping, and other activities.
- ⑦ To assist as needed in the conversion from CLSI to the CARL online system.
- ⑧ To become familiar with and/or assist in other Public Services Departments.

Specific and measurable objectives accompany each goal. Recognizing the immense time impact on Information Services staff, especially the head of the department, Denison Library will explore the possibilities of offering a regular internship program sometime in the future. Also recognizing the unlikelihood of getting another intern such as Donna Keslin (!), funding sources will be explored so that a stipend could be offered.

The only incentives we were able to offer our intern were free parking and worker's compensation, both through the University Hospital Volunteer Services. The Library will give Ms. Keslin a certificate of completion as well as arm her with necessary letters of reference at the conclusion of the program.

Ms. Keslin is exploring several options to pursue when she has completed this internship program.

Never let it be said that Denison Library staff looked a gift horse.....!

## Professional Collection Now Available to MCMLA Membership

Included with this issue of the MCMLA Express is a list of titles in the Isabelle T. Anderson Collection of the Colorado Council of Medical Librarians (CCML). This is a professional collection for medical librarians which has recently become available to MCMLA members through the cooperative efforts of CCML, Denison Memorial Library of the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center and the Education Committee of MCMLA.

### Background

In 1980 when the Collection was begun, access to library science literature in Colorado was limited. A donation to the CCML treasury from Teresa Martin, a charter CCML member, in memory of Isabelle T. Anderson provided the impetus to build a professional collection. Isabelle T. Anderson, whose obituary appears in the *Bulletin of the Medical Library Association* 1972 Jan;60(1):171-172, was a much-loved medical librarian who served several libraries in our region and later followed Estelle Broadman from the National Library of Medicine to Washington University. She was MLA's president (1958/1959) and contributed chapters to the first two editions of the *Handbook of Medical Library Practice*. Early hospital librarians in the Denver area remember her warmth and her interest in the continuing education of her colleagues.

### The Collection

The collection has grown with donations from CCML members, including several titles from Dr. Frank B. Roger's personal collection, and titles purchased with regular contributions from the CCML treasury. The newest additions to the collection, the audiovisuals and the MLA syllabi will be listed in future issues of the Express.

MCMLA members are encouraged to make cash donations (checks payable to "Denison Memorial Library") toward the purchase of new books. Those wishing to donate titles to the collection are asked to first send a list to Pat Nelson of Denison's Collection Development Department. The Isabelle T. Anderson Collection is fully integrated into the Denison collection and additions will be made in accordance with the Collection Development Policy. New purchases for the collection - there are ten new titles on order - will be announced in the *MCMLA Express*, and Denison has offered to print a complete list of holdings for annual distribution via the *Express*.

### Access

To borrow a title from the list, send an interlibrary loan request to Denison Memorial Library, University of Colorado Health Sciences Center, via DOCLINE (LIBID 80262A), OCLC's ILL Subsystem (COU), or an ALA form. Denison ordinarily charges \$7.00 per loan for out-of-state requests and \$5.00 per loan for Colorado borrowers, but MCMLA will pay any interlibrary loan fees for its members' personal requests who want to borrow from collection. Be sure that your ILL request includes the note "Bill to MCMLA" somewhere on the form or in a COMMENTS or NOTES field of the record.



## Denison Adopts CARL!!

The University of Colorado Health Sciences Center, Denison Memorial Library is converting to the CARL integrated library system. CARL will replace the three stand-alone systems being used for acquisitions, circulation, and serials control.

Denison Library has been on the CLSI circulation system since 1979. CLSI has been an extremely reliable system over the years, and with some modification served as the library's online catalog. The PHILSOM serials control system was installed in 1980 and currently runs on an IBM PC-AT. Also, in 1980 an in-house acquisitions system was developed to order and provide reports on books. That system is still in place, and runs on an Apple IIe microcomputer.

The Library is pleased to join the community of CARL libraries. CARL (Colorado Alliance of Research Libraries) is a multi-type network, including academic, public, and special libraries. Denison's staff and clients will appreciate the many benefits of this network. Chief among these are expanded access to a common database of Colorado libraries' holdings, increased ease of use, and an integration of all internal library functions.

Future plans for CARL include adding and/or creating links with libraries in Arizona, California, Maryland, Ohio, and Wyoming.

Denison anticipates having the CARL system in place by July 1, 1989.





## Book Reviews

**Nancy Peterson**

**Older Is Better**, compiled by Elizabeth Vierck. (Acropolis Books Ltd., 2400 17th Street NW, Washington DC 20009. Send \$10.20 (includes \$2.25 for postage & handling).

Volume One of an excellent five-volume series on aging, Prime Time I-V. (The other volumes cover health, safety and well-being; finances, employment, and volunteering; housing, independent living, and legal issues; and health care and health insurance.) Elizabeth Vierck, gerontologist and consultant to the Senate, has compiled facts about the good and bad news on aging. Her positive outlook is delightfully supported by interviews with such successful senior citizens as Bob Hope, Julia Child, Maggie Kuhn, and Claude Pepper. The Appendix lists by state over 650 agencies which provide services to the elderly. Many federally-funded services, including senior centers, home-care workers, transportation, counseling, meal programs, information and referral are available by knowing whom to contact.

[The following title is a controversial one and represents a distinct point of view. It is one you may want to be aware of.]

**AIDS and the Doctors of Death**, by Dr. Alan Cantwell, Jr. (Aries Rising Press, P.O. 29532, Los Angeles, CA 90029. Send \$18.95 (plus \$1.00 postage and handling).

A provocative and in-depth inquiry into the origin of the AIDS epidemic written by a dermatologist and internationally known cancer researcher. This book examines the theory that AIDS is a biowarfare experiment proliferated in the gay community. Using evidence uncovered by internist Dr. Robert Strecker, the author traces the AIDS epidemic to contaminated hepatitis B vaccine used in six American cities during the years 1978-81. The ten stimulating chapters are each followed by detailed references and there are subject and proper name indices at the end. The book raises questions concerning not only the power politics of medicine and research grants but also the types of experiments being conducted today.

## News Notes

- Margaret Bandy has been elected as the MCMLA candidate for the MLA nominating committee.
- The Kirksville College of Osteopathic Medicine held a dedication of the A.T. Still Memorial Library on May 5, 1989. The new library size is 11,300 square feet and was renovated by Warner-Nease-Bost Architects, Inc. at a cost of \$600,000. For more information contact the A.T. - The University of Colorado Health Sciences Center's Denison Memorial Library will be installing SilverPlatter's MultiPlatter system. MultiPlatter is a modular stand alone CD-ROM network. The system includes a server workstation, networking software (Novell), network interface cards (Ethernet), and SilverPlatter Network Manager Software.

This is a "controlled release" by SilverPlatter, who will be working with the various installation sites as new software enhancements are developed. After testing MultiPlatter at a small number of control sites, SilverPlatter will make the product available for general release.

Denison Library will be obtaining the server with 5 CD-ROM disc drives. Two subscriptions to MEDLINE, backfiles to 1978, and CINAHL will be mounted on MultiPlatter. In addition, a stand alone station will support SilverPlatter's Cancer-CD file. A second stand alone station may later be devoted to Micromedex's drug information CD-ROM.

The SilverPlatter system and CD products will replace Compact Cambridge and Dialog MEDLINE CD-ROM products previously used at Denison Library.
